All films will be projected digitally, unless otherwise stated in the description online at **bfi.org.uk/lff**

SUBTITLES

Films not in the English language will be screened with English subtitles. Details are listed on **bfi.org.uk/lff** and in the description in the brochure (correct at time of printing and subtitles may be added after tickets are on sale).

FILMING AND AUDIO RECORDING

Many of the events may be photographed, filmed or audio recorded by the Festival. By entering Festival venues, you are consenting to such filming or audio recording and its subsequent use by the BFI and trusted third parties. Please contact the venue manager if you have any concerns.

CERTIFICATES

All BFI London Film Festival titles are for persons 15 and over unless they are in the family section or have received a lower BBFC certificate. Films and events certified as over 18 are indicated at the point of purchase.

ANTI-PIRACY POLICY

In the interest of the artists and creators, we take piracy very seriously and take any and all legal measures available. Cameras are not permitted in Festival screenings.

Recording sound, taking pictures or filming during the screening is illegal and any person caught in the act of filming will be immediately expelled. Unauthorised recording and streaming is prohibited on BFI Player. Advanced security measures are in place to prevent and track piracy.

CONTENT ADVICE

We all experience the world differently. Some films and works contain distressing themes, scenes, language and references that may be triggering to some audience members. To help you decide if a particular screening or event is for you, please see individual programme pages for content and trigger warnings (including use of flashing imagery) as well as age recommendations and certificates.

ACCESS AT THE FESTIVAL

We want everyone to enjoy the BFI London Film Festival, and for the experience to be as welcoming, inclusive and accessible as possible.

We offer a number of accessible screenings, Q&As and events.

Visit **bfi.org.uk/Iff/access** for a full list of accessible screenings and events, and venue accessibility information.

Accessibility options, including descriptive subtitles and BSL-interpreted introductions and Q&As, may be added to screenings at a later stage. If they're added after tickets go on sale, we'll tell existing ticketholders.

ACCESSIBLE CINEMA SCREENINGS

- Descriptive on-screen English subtitles including descriptions of non-dialogue audio.
- BSI British Sign Language-interpreted introductions, Q&As and events seats are allocated to ensure a clear view of the stage for lip-reading or of the interpreter.
- Audio description soundtrack with narration including descriptions of key visual elements via headsets available on request.
- Relaxed screenings with house lights on a low level, reduced volume and programme introductions for neurodivergent audiences, their companions and assistants.

ACCESSIBLE SHORT FILMS ON BFI PLAYER

All English-language LFF short films have:

- Closed caption subtitles including descriptions of non-dialogue audio.
- And Audio description with narration including descriptions of key visual elements of the film.

BOOKING ACCESS TICKETS

A limited number of tickets have been set aside for customers with specific seating requirements, including wheelchair spaces, aisle seats for guests with restricted mobility and seats with a clear view of the stage for lipreading or of the interpreter for BSL-interpreted screenings and events.

Access tickets are available on a first come, first served basis and subject to BFI Membership priority booking periods.

Access tickets for accessible screenings are kept aside, even if general tickets are sold out.



OPENING NIGHT GALA **BLITZ**

Steve McQueen's visually dazzling tour de force is a moving and expansive tapestry of British life during the decisive moments of the Second World War.

In the face of nightly air raids, East End mum Rita (yet another impressive turn by Saoirse Ronan) grows increasingly worried about her son George's safety. Under the counsel of her father, Gerald (Paul Weller), she makes the heart-wrenching decision to send him to the countryside. But a few hours into his journey, George alights the train, determined to return to Stepney Green and his family. Friends and foes stalk London's streets, but each encounter populates George's map of his world, giving him an understanding of how his fellow citizens are affected by these tumultuous times.

ACROSS THE UK

McQueen's incredible ensemble cast includes Kathy Burke, Benjamin Clémentine, Harris Dickinson and Stephen Graham. They inhabit a war-torn London that's impeccably realised by Adam Stockhausen's (12 Years a Slave, Asteroid City) production design and Yorick Le Saux's (A Bigger Splash, Irma Vep) cinematography, while Hans Zimmer's score revels in the scale and intimacy of the director's vision. But the film's trump card is newcomer Elliott Heffernan, who captures George's emotional strength, impish humour and sense of loyalty to his family with a wisdom beyond his years. Through him, McQueen's Blitz represents one of the finest portrayals of life in a moment of crisis, perseverance and renewal. KM

CLOSING NIGHT GALA PIECE BY PIECE

Morgan Neville chronicles the life of cultural icon Pharrell Williams through LEGO® animation in this unforgettable journey of unbridled joy and creative freedom.

Depicting one's life story with LEGO® pieces might sound crazv, but for Pharrell Williams it was the only way employing a medium that could mirror his musical career and creative spirit, defying all genre trappings and allowing audiences to be transported to wonderful places with limitless possibilities. Through Pharrell's LEGO®-rendered first-hand account, Oscar® winner Morgan Neville's (Twenty Feet from Stardom; Won't You Be My Neighbor?) documentary first takes us to the artist's childhood home in Virginia Beach, where his love of music first began. Piecing together his journey, from a teenage musician playing in a garage to international superstar gracing the biggest stages, we're guided through Pharrell's incredibly prolific and storied career, which includes his work in the band N.E.R.D. and as part of the producing duo The Neptunes (beautifully showcased in a head-spinning sequence of hits that reminds us how wide their influence stretches).

The film also encompasses his solo endeavours, as well as collaborations with Kendrick Lamar and Daft Punk. Pictured through Neville's sensitive gaze and featuring interviews with a star-studded LEGO®-rendered cast that includes Jay-Z, Missy Elliot, Gwen Stefani, Busta Rhymes and Snoop Dogg, this is an exuberant, inventive and refreshingly self-aware celebration of creativity. AMERICAN EXPRESS GALA ELTON JOHN: NEVER TOO LATE

Follow Sir Elton John on his final US live shows in this candid and riveting documentary by R.J. Cutler and David Furnish.

In 1975, Elton John played his largest US shows, with two sold-out performances at LA's Dodger Stadium. Over the previous five years, he and lyricist Bernie Taupin, who wrote their first song together in 1969, had risen through the ranks of a new generation of artists on both sides of the Atlantic. The concert at Dodger Stadium was recorded shortly after the autobiographical Captain Fantastic and the Brown Dirt Cowboy became the first Elton John album to debut at number one in the US. It took place at a pivotal point in the singer-songwriter's career, as he battled addiction and confusion about his sexuality. Elton John: Never Too Late follows him as he makes his triumphant return to Dodger Stadium, now a markedly different man out and proud, a husband, a father and on the cusp of retirement as a live performer. What hasn't changed is his love for music and performance.

Sean Baker won the Palme d'Or at Cannes with this enthralling drama, featuring a star-making performance from Mikey Madison.

Baker (Florida Project, Red Rocket) presents a modern-day Cinderella story about Ani, a young sex worker from Brooklyn, meeting Vanya, a spoiled son of a Russian oligarch, who offers her a glamorous new life of possibility and incredible wealth. Ani's wild ride and fairytale is soon threatened when news of their whirlwind marriage gets back to Russia, resulting in Vanya's parents flying to New York to manage the situation. Both wildly entertaining and heartbreaking, Anora takes audiences on a freewheeling, rambunctious adventure that escalates to dizzying levels. Drawing comparisons to Pretty Woman, it constantly plays with genre and audience expectations. But what shines through most, as it does in all of his films, is Baker's love for and unwillingness to judge his characters. IM

A Faustian bargain lies at the heart of Ali Abbasi's stunningly crafted dramatisation of Donald Trump's early career in New York.

Sebastian Stan and Succession's Jeremy Strong give career-best performances as Trump and Roy Cohn the notorious attorney who became his mentor just as he was seeking to escape his father's shadow. Displaying a glint of charm that never fully eclipses Trump's unwavering ambition. Stan's portraval perfectly contrasts with Strong's, who renders Cohn (previously a key character in Angels in America) as a sinister and fear-mongering practitioner of the dark arts in American public life. Continuing his singular examination of the coruscating nature of power that he began in Border and Holy Spider, Abbasi here widens his perspective to examine a city in the throes of a power grab. Different film stock is used to reflect the decades and changing fortunes of New York, as it emerged from near-bankruptcy to become a financial behemoth. And at its centre lie two figures who would cut a path that reflected and then reshaped a country's psyche. KM




THE MAYOR OF LONDON'S GALA WE LIVE IN TIME

Based on her bestselling journal, and the video diary that chronicled her gruelling battle for justice, this is a powerful and unique document that breaks the taboo over rape in Japan. LB

Bored housewife Sonoko is infatuated by the younger Mitsuko. As the women embark on an affair, they are soon tangled in a psychosexual web of power games, blood oaths and suicide pacts. Gloriously framed in widescreen and told without moralising, *Manji* has no equivalent in Western cinema – unless you imagine Douglas Sirk with added sex and the melodrama dialled to eleven. RB

Filmed on location around the waterways of Xochimilco, cinematographer Gabriel Figueroa captures this remarkable remnant of the Aztec capital in thrillingly high contrast black and white.
